Fall Mission Trip

The most recent medical, dental, construction and VBS campaign took place October 8-12. For the first time, the medical clinic was located in the Lutheran Church one block from the OSA house.

This time we really wanted to focus on the poorer areas of Collique. The week before the campaign, the OSA Peru team went up in the hills of Collique to post posters and hand out flyers to the people to create awareness of the campaign.

As before, the people were waiting in line for the inscriptions the week before the campaign. They had been waiting for the US doctors to arrive.

They didn't only come from Collique. People here pass the word to their family members in other parts of Peru. Dr. Sam Law said, "I saw a 76 year old woman who had travelled by bus from the Amazon jungle, over the Andes, and all the way to Collique to be seen in our clinic. She was also visiting family in Lima, but had come at this time because she had heard that we were going to be in Collique. She seemed reassured after I examined her and talked to her. It didn't seem like much to me, but it was very important to her. God uses our gifts in ways that we cannot imagine."

Dr. Luis Campos shared with the team that the promotion in the higher parts of Collique

could be recognized in the health problems of the patients. "At some moments, it was depressive to see such needs, but it affirmed the reason of us being here," he said.

The light of God's love is not only shining, it is also making an impact. Daniel Alcazar, who has been on former trips, noted, "I have noticed a change in the way people behave as they wait to be seen." He also talked with a lady who came to the campaign last year. "She found out she had cancer through a pap smear conducted in our clinic last year. She is now cancer free after receiving treatment at a local hospital," he shared.

Besides the medical clinic situated in the church, the OSA house was the location of the dental, eye, and ear clinics. There was also a team to do VBS with the children of the OSA program and their friends and a smaller group that completed some construction projects in the community.

The VBS team taught the children about Moses and how his life is a testimony of an existing God who has a plan for our lives. We pray that the stories and testimonies of the group will have an impact in their lives as they continue to grow.

May the love God shines through us be recognized by the people we interact with each day as we continue to minister to these precious people in Collique.

"Shine, Jesus, shine. Fill this land with the Father's glory."



Group Wedding

Saturday, October 13, the day after the campaign, was the big day eleven couples had been waiting for; some of them for many years.

These couples participated in a Christian marriage course "Felizmente Casados" (Happily Married), which OSA started in May. The course helped the couples to enrich their relationships and thereby improve the dynamics of the relationship of the whole family including the children.

The idea of the course started because many of the couples in our community don't have a formalized marriage for different reasons; the economic situation is one of them.

"The "Felizmente Casados" classes were held once each month under the direction of a Christian pastor couple, Angel and Charito





Zamora. Course materials included topics such as: marriage is a pact, one flesh, functions of each partner, forgiveness, sexual intimacy, communication, and prayer in the marriage.

Charo, OSA's social worker, made sure all the legal paperwork was completed correctly and Elizabett planned the course and religious wedding. During the final week of preparations and on the morning of the ceremony, the whole team worked hard to make it an unforgettable day for these families.

Members of the OSA mission team (with the exception of those who needed to return to the US early) attended the marriage ceremony, during which Dr. Luis Campos and his wife, Ruth, also renewed their vows. It was an emotional experience for Ruth and Luis to see these couples and their children whom they

have known for more than six years dressed in wedding attire and exchanging Christian marriage vows.

After the ceremony, the couples went to their homes to celebrate with their families and friends. Kees and Elizabett represented OSA in some of the weddings. "I thank God for providing everything for this marriage course and wedding," said Elizabett, "but I am even more thankful for the couples who in front of all their family and friends thanked God for this day and all they learned from the course."
